With its traditional architecture the picturesque old city of Kaleiçi, with its narrow winding streets and wooden houses abut the ancient city walls.

How to get to Antalya?

Getting to Antalya is easy, as it is one of the larger cities in Turkey, so there are major routes available for travelers to take. There are also constant domestic flights arriving and departing from all over Türkiye, with the flight time from Istanbul only 1 hour 15 min.
